Pioneers,

In terms of academics, our first recommendation is getting a ParentConnect account so you can access your student's grades and attendance. Make sure you visit teachers' iblog pages as they regularly update them with daily announcements, assignments, and resources. Many teachers use Remind to send updates to students and families so please sign up for those too. If you visit our school website, you can find each staff member with their email address and their iblog page; feel free to contact them to find out how best to support your students from home.

It is important that your child is in school every day. If they are going to miss please call in their absence. This year, we will be monitoring attendance more closely, specifically unexcused absences and tardies. If a student is marked unexcused, our goal is to determine the cause and provide support where needed, which may lead to increased parent and student contact. Students who are consistently tardy to class, arriving late, will also be counseled and possibly assigned a consequence. Again, our goal is to increase the amount of time students are in class as we know it has a direct relationship on their success.

Lastly, I will make every effort to send out weekly emails; if you are yet to receive an email from me please contact the office to ensure your email address is current, so you can stay connected to the amazing things that are going on at Dearborn High.

"Always in the lead" is the Dearborn High motto and I'm excited about working with you to help create that expectation for your children.

DEARBORN PUBLIC SCHOOLS HIGH SCHOOL ATTENDANCE POLICY

Regular attendance plays a huge role in academic success; in fact, Michigan state law requires regular attendance.

Students who don't attend regularly may have a difficult time passing classes and may not graduate on time. Habitual absence or tardiness results in serious lapses in the accumulation of knowledge, enrichment, practical and physical skills, self-discipline, and a sense of responsibility. Teachers and administrators consider class attendance and promptness significant components affecting a student's grade.

Parents and students have a responsibility for attendance and are encouraged to schedule medical and dental appointments, personal business, and vacations outside of school hours.

- A. The attendance rules and regulations require a procedure for involving parents or guardian in the validation of the student's absence. Therefore, under this attendance practice the parent or guardian is required to call the school to verify the student's absence **within 24 hours or the absence is unexcused**. This procedure applies to all students within the senior high school program of the Dearborn Public Schools.
- B. Unexcused Absences will be subject to Administrative Discipline.**
- C. Excessive Absences can result in "Reduced Credit" within a course. (Please see "Reduced Credit Policy" Below.)
- D. The teacher, and/or a member of the DHS Intervention Team, will meet with each student at five absences and provide the student with written notice indicating that the student has reached five absences. The student and teacher will sign the form acknowledging this conference. The parents/family will also be notified in writing that the student has reached five absences.
- E. A letter will be mailed to the parents or guardians when a student reaches 10 absences.

REDUCED CREDIT POLICY

Students accumulating 10 or more qualifying absences, excused or unexcused, in one semester may receive reduced credit in those classes where the absences occur.

Dearborn High School defines absences as follows:

Failure to serve a detention or a community ownership will result in immediate Office Discipline Referral to Administration.

PROCEDURE FOR DAILY ATTENDANCE

Absences:

1. The parent or legal guardian is responsible for calling in their son/daughter's absence within 24 hours. Phone calls and/or contact after 24 hours may not result in an "excusal".
Call the Attendance Office at (313) 827-1601.
A recording is available 24 hours a day.
2. When a student is absent from class without a parent phone call to excuse the absence on that day, parents will receive a message notifying them of their child's "unexcused" absence.

Late Arrivals:

3. Whenever a student is entering the building after the morning tardy bell, he/she must check in at the Attendance Office.
A student who brings food or beverages to school after the tardy bell will not be able to take the items into their classrooms.

Leaving the Building:

4. When a student must leave the building during the day, **parents must call to excuse the student prior to the start of the school day.** The student is responsible to pick up a pass in the Attendance Office before 1st hour to have him/her released from class.
 - a. Though we understand emergencies occur, this is the best way to ensure a student is dismissed at the requested time
5. No student will be allowed to sign out with the office without contacting the parent to give student permission to leave regardless of the student's age.
6. Upon returning to school that same day, the student must again stop in the Attendance Office and provide proof of appointment in order to be readmitted the same day.
7. **No one will be allowed to sign out for lunch.**



Did you know that NHS is the nation's oldest and best-known student recognition program and that it was founded in 1921 by the National Association of Secondary School Principals? At Dearborn High School, our chapter is nearly half a century old. This year, we continue to follow a long tradition of character, scholarship, leadership, and service as our seniors plan for memorable and unique experiences. Senior NHS members met the third week of September to form committees and begin planning their service projects. As part of various individual and community projects, NHS students will be tutoring and service learning, organizing clothes and blood drives, setting up beautification projects, and planning the juniors' induction ceremony in November. Some of our biweekly meetings will specifically target servicing Dearborn High School and discussions are under way for how we can best optimize our service. We are eager and excited to join hands with people from our community to give and give back.

However, there are also ways for seniors to receive too. As members of NHS, seniors are eligible to apply for an NHS Scholarship. If they are maintaining the required 3.5 GPA for membership and doing their service hours, they should consider it today. About \$1.5 million in NHS scholarships will be awarded this year among 500 applicants. Transcripts are sent to colleges electronically now. Students need to sign up at www.parchment.com and follow the steps to set up an account to request your transcripts.

The SAT & ACT Test Dates 2018-19 are posted in the counseling department. Students can register online at www.sat.org/register or www.actstudent.org.

Remember, SAT & ACT scores must be sent electronically through the College Board & ACT websites when applying to college.



Help your student improve their reasoning...

Most students will hit “bumps in the road” during their high school math career. Undoubtedly, this struggle helps them grow in conceptual understanding, procedural fluency and critical thinking. If your child is expressing discomfort with the struggle in Math, as a parent, you can help them figure out what is going on, gather resources available to them, and figure out a plan of action together. You might start by considering these questions:

- Is my child outgoing enough to ask for help? Or is he or she shy and likely to want to fly under the radar if they don't understand something?
- Is my child willing to persevere when a problem or assignment is challenging?
- Is there something bigger going on in my child's life that could be distracting them?

A few of the concepts learned in high school math courses are often the first real challenge for high achieving students. This can be difficult for both parents and students to cope with. You might think, “My kid usually does so well in math, this isn't like him!” Please understand that there is a lot more that goes into learning the Michigan Merit Math Curriculum than pure aptitude. A few weeks of poor study habits, not diligently showing work in math problems, or getting distracted in class may cause an otherwise successful student to feel lost.

Or maybe you know your student has struggled with math in the past and this is not a huge surprise. It is important to identify gaps in procedural fluency with basic concepts like fractions, negative numbers and solving equations that will make learning new concepts in high school difficult because they rely on the foundation built in previous years. This will give you a good idea of the depth of assistance your child will need. Please be sure to contact your child's math teacher with any questions, comments or concerns and consider sending your child to the DHS free math tutoring each Tuesday through Thursday!


